27 September 2018 - The Yukon Chamber of Commerce (YCC) congratulates Stanley Noel (YCC Chairperson) for his nomination and acceptance to the Board of Directors of the Canadian Chamber of Commerce.

Stanley has been the Chair for the Yukon Chamber since June 2016 and is one of few Northerners who holds the distinction as a certified Corporate Director (ICD.D) with the University of Toronto's Rotman School of Business Institute of Corporate Directors Program.

Peter Turner, YCC President explained that "with Stanley's professional background as an experienced Corporate Director, combined with his wealth of Business experience, he will make a great addition to the Canadian Chamber of Commerce Board. We are very lucky to have someone of this caliber from the Yukon agree to represent our interests at the National level, and joining three other new and incumbent territorial board members, significantly increases the northern voice on the Canadian Chamber of Commerce board."
